The approach to all deteriorating or critically ill patients is the same. The underlying principles are: Use the Airway, Breathing, Circulation, Disability, Exposure (ABCDE) approach to assess and treat the patient. Do a complete initial assessment and re-assess regularly. Treat life-threatening problems before moving to the next part of assessment.

Clinical approach to the diagnosis of autoimmune encephalitis in the pediatric patient. Diagnosing AE is based on the combination of a clinical history consistent with pediatric AE and supportive diagnostic testing, which includes but is not dependent on antibody testing. The proposed criteria and algorithm require validation in prospective pediatric cohorts.

**Clinical approach to the diagnosis of autoimmune ...**

Attention to the emotional area allows: (i) promotion of a psychological elaboration that integrates information and emotions, facilitating memorization and consolidation of new information; (ii) creation of a relational context in a dedicated area for listening to the patient and his/her parents (knowing what he/she knows, how the patient lives with the illness, how much it influences them and their family); (iii) supporting the resources and skills of the patient and parents.

Results Existing consensus criteria for adult AE were refined for use in children. Provisional pediatric AE classification criteria and an algorithm to facilitate early diagnosis are proposed.
